RADIUM FOR CANCER

£6,000 for Half Gramme

Additional buildings will be erected, and special equipment provided for the custody of the half gramme, which will be kept in a safe of special steel 6 in. thick. Radium treatment will be brought within the range of the poor.

It was also announced recently that Westminster Hospital had decided to spend £20,000 on the immediate purchase of further supplies of radium. The amount procurable for that sum is less than onefifteenth of an ounce, the usual price of radium being about £12,000 a gramme (.035 oz.).

Now that radium treatment is being anplied with increasing success to malienant growths, ulcers, and skin diseases it is believed that the time has come when every hospital should have its own sup-
