For His Honor's Decision

- ✓ 1. Mr Eastman's claim that should a Mission have occupied any land for 10 (or 20) years this gives them an absolute right, as against the owner of the land, to occupy it in perpetuity.
- ✓ 2. Mr Eastman's request to go around with me on the "John Williams" and have all Mission lands defined, marked, and registered, together with the conditions of tenure.
- ✓ 3. The question of splitting up villages and allowing natives to live near their lands. May I be allowed to settle such questions as they immediately concern land?
In particular the question of Central Tabitenua Island. Trycatch
4. May I be permitted to settle up the areas of administration on each island when the Lands Commission is sitting there?
In particular may I have authority under the relevant Ordinances to:-
 - (a) Review Sentences,
 - (b) Confirm Divorces.
- ✓ 5. May recognized customs, which in spite of Mr Grubbe's statements to the contrary exist on several islands, by which land may be given to individuals outside the family of the donor, be recognized.
In particular - illustrate by the land customs of Bernu, and Te Alan Tabin in the Southern Gilberts, and as an extreme example Teotia's request to give a piece of land in exchange for a bicycle - he had the consent of his Mta.
- ✓ 6. What customs should be regarded as contrary to the penal code of the Colony?
Illustrations - Te Alan Tusalva on Bernu.



✓7. May the Lands Commission make decisions such as 'no gullies' which was to the effect that Fish traps may be built beside other traps which had not been in use for 10 years.

✓8. are the following rights to be recognized:-
 (a) Freshwater rights - Driftwood, Porpoise etc.,
 (b) Lagoon Fishing Rights,
 (c) Reef Fishing Rights.

Would it make any difference whether the people had not had them for a period of years or whether they did, or did not, want them back.

✓9. If an energetic individual or group builds an enclosing wall and reclaims land from the sea or lagoon, may they keep it by decision of the Commission?
 In particular Mr. Rudoch's decision at Teawai on Tabiteuea Island.
