

**A SCOTCH DELEGATE AT THE UNIVERSITY.**

Early in the proceedings at the University commemoration on Wednesday afternoon the Chancellor said he understood Mr. E. E. Morrison, M.A., one of the Scottish agricultural delegates, was in the hall, and he invited him to take a seat on the platform beside the Governor. Mr. Morrison complied with the request, and was tendered a hearty reception. Sir Samuel Way said he welcomed Mr. Morrison, who no doubt had realised during his travels that Australia owed a great deal to his countrymen. They would like him to know that that University also owed much to two of his countrymen, the late Sir W. W. Hughes, its founder, and the late Sir Thomas Elder, whose total contributions to the institution reached £100,000. Mr. Morrison might also be reminded that a son of a Scotch shepherd who graduated in science in one of the universities of the old land came out to South Australia, where he taught the farmers a scientific course of agriculture, which had resulted in the farm products of the State having been more than doubled. He asked Mr. Morrison to tell the people of Scotland that if they came here they would find the same opportunities for learning as they enjoyed there, and that there was every chance for their children to reach the pinnacle of fame. Mr. Morrison said the unexpected compliment embarrassed him. His great interest in education had attracted him to the University that day, and he had been a most interested spectator and listener. He would have great pleasure in reporting favorably on what he had seen in connection with South Australia, and hoped a representative of the Adelaide University would be sent to Scotland next year to attend the 500th anniversary of St. Andrew's University. He would see that an invitation was sent. Mr. Morrison was accommodated with a chair beside the Governor.

At the University commemoration on Wednesday afternoon the Rev. T. B. Angwin, M.A., who took his degree at the Melbourne University, was admitted ad eundem gradum to the degree in the Adelaide institution. Later in the afternoon his son, Mr. H. T. M. Angwin, was admitted to the degree of Bachelor of Science, and another son, Mr. W. B. Angwin, B.Sc., was granted the diploma in applied science, having won his degree last year.
