

RHODES SCHOLARSHIP.

DR. FRY SELECTED.

A meeting of the selection committee for the Rhodes Scholarship was held at Government House on Friday, there being present—His Excellency the Governor (chairman), Messrs. G. J. R. Murray and J. R. Fowler, Professors Bragg and Henderson, and the secretary (Mr. C. R. Hodge). An apology for non-attendance was received from Sir Samuel Way. Six candidates for the scholarship presented themselves, and after a careful consideration of the merits of each candidate, the committee unanimously selected Henry Kenneth Fry, B.Sc., M.B., B.S., as the South Australian Rhodes scholar for 1909.

Dr. Henry Kenneth Fry was born a North Adelaide on May 25, 1886. He was a student at Prince Alfred College, and his scholastic career is thus given—1.00, passed Junior Public Examination, eleventh on honor list; 1901, passed Senior Public Examination first class, eighth on honor list; John Robb scholarship; 1902, passed Higher Public Examination, first class, fifth on honor list, third University scholarship; Cotton medal; 1903, only first class in the first year medical, Sir Thomas Elder scholarship; 1904, only first class in the second year medical, Sir Thomas Elder scholarship; 1905, B.Sc. degree, with first class honors in physiology; 1906, head of first class in third year, medical, Dr. Davies Thomas scholarship; 1907, head of first class in fourth year medical, Dr. Davies Thomas scholarship; 1908, only first class in fifth year medical, Everard scholarship. He is a member of junior University across team, a member of Y.M.C.A. gymnasium class, a member of the crew of the yacht Katie, was twice a member of Y.M.C.A. swimming teams in races against O.B.I.; is a member of the University swimming team. He twice secured the second prize with his own boat in dinghy races, and was twice a member of the crew of the yacht Katie when she was successful in races across the gulf. He rowed bow in the medical crew when they won the Junior Schools race. He is a member of the A lacrosse team, and has been awarded the lacrosse "blue," and is a member of the P.A.C. old scholars' lacrosse team.

Dr. Fry is secretary and president of the University Christian Union, a member of Medical Students' Society committee, a member of the committee of the Scientific Society (University), treasurer of Union Room committee, secretary of the Medical Students' Society, and senior member of the editorial committee of the Medical Students' Review. He was examiner in physiology in the Junior and Senior Public Examinations for three years.

Dr. Fry, who is declared by the Chancellor and the Dean of Faculty of Medicine to be one of the most brilliant graduates of the University, is a fine type of Australian, of medium height, but strongly and muscularly built, and should give a good account of himself in the athletic world at Oxford. Naturally he is delighted at his success, and states he will probably leave for England about the middle of next year.

A letter from the Royal Commissioners of the Exhibition of 1851, inviting the University of Adelaide to recommend a candidate for a Science Research Scholarship of the annual value of £150 for the year 1909, was considered by the council on Friday; and, on the recommendation of the Faculty of Science, Joseph Leslie Glasson, B.Sc., was nominated.

On the recommendation of the Faculties of Law and Science, Thomas John Browne, LL.B., and Lancelot Salisbury Bagster, B.Sc., have been awarded by the council of the University of Adelaide David Murray Scholarships for the year 1909.

On the recommendation of the Public Examinations Board, the Senior Commercial Scholarship has been awarded by the council of the University of Adelaide to Ernest Edward Baseby.
