A DIPLOMA OF COMMERCE.  
 The diploma in commerce established by the University of Adelaide, and to be conferred this year on the first batch of successful students, twelve in number, is another illustration of the growing importance of technical training in commercial life. The course embraces classes under capable professional gentlemen for the study of accountancy, banking, and currency, business practice, commercial law, economics, and technology. As these classes all meet at night they afford opportunities for ambitious young men to use their leisure in qualifying themselves for important positions in the world of commerce. That the value of the training is being recognised is evident from the fact that some recent public appointments, notably in connection with the Tramways Trust, have gone to students from the University. Those who wish to specialise in certain directions are at liberty to do so, and large numbers of bank clerks avail themselves of the lectures in banking and currency and commercial law, certificates being awarded to those successful in passing examinations in any subject. Only for those going for the diploma is it necessary to take the whole course. The distinction can be reached by fairly easy stages in about five years, but those aspiring to win it must be prepared to work. The University in New Zealand has established a degree in commerce, and a diploma in commerce has also been established in connection with the Sydney University. The curriculum of the Adelaide University cannot be said to suffer in comparison with either of them. In order to encourage members of their staff to take the course some of the banks and commercial houses have on the final examination being passed refunded the students the whole of the fees.

At a meeting of the council of the University of Adelaide on Friday the first Tinline Scholarship for history was awarded to Alexander Clifford Vernon Melbourne, with Hugh Denney Simpson as proxime accessit. The Tinline Scholarship was founded last year, when Mr. G. J. R. Murray, K.C., a member of the council, gave to the University £1,000 to establish from the income scholarships in memory of the family of his mother, to be called the "Tinline Scholarships." The conditions were that there should be two scholarships tenable for two years each, one of which should be awarded every year on the examination in history for the degree of Bachelor of Arts; each scholar to prepare an original thesis on some subject of Imperial or colonial history, and to receive £20 per annum.
