UNIVERSITY LANDS.

The COMMISSIONER of CROWN LANDS, in reply to Mr. Campbell, said that after a long time arrangements had been made for the purchase of the University lands.

Mr. VAUGHAN asked what the Government intended to do with the lands. Would they be offered under covenant of purchase?

The COMMISSIONER of CROWN LANDS said the lands were endowed to the University authorities, but the latter in some cases could not collect the rents and asked the Government for inscribed stock instead. The lands would be offered like others on perpetual leases or under covenant to purchase.

Mr. ARCHIBALD asked whether, assuming that inscribed stock fell below par, the University authorities would come on the Government for the difference if they wanted to sell out.

The COMMISSIONER of CROWN LANDS replied that all he knew was that the Government had the land and the University had the stock. They would do what they liked with the stock, and the Government would do as it liked with the land.

Mr. VAUGHAN asked if it was a proper policy for the Government to enter into arrangement without the consent of the House for the sale of land which was endowed to an institution.

The COMMISSIONER of CROWN LANDS said land could only be dealt with under the Act as it was.

Mr. VAUGHAN said he did not think that was a straight answer. Was it necessary to introduce fresh legislation so that the Government would first receive the sanction of the House to sell such lands?

The COMMISSIONER of CROWN LANDS said he had given the only reply possible. The only way to deal with land was under the Act before them. Until the Act was altered all land must be dealt with under its provisions. That was the only possible reply. If Mr. Vaughan wanted to know his opinion as to the question of such land being granted on perpetual leases, he could say it would probably be put under the present Act in a perpetual lease, or else with the covenant for right to purchase. A number of leaseholders—the bulk of them—were taking up land under perpetual leases because it was a little cheaper that way than under the covenant to purchase.

The Hon. R. BUTLER enquired what was the total area of the University lands, the amount received from them, the amount the Government had paid for the lands, and what interest the University would receive under the present arrangement.

The COMMISSIONER of CROWN LANDS said he could not supply that information without notice.

Mr. VAUGHAN asked if it would not be possible for the park lands and other domains of the State to be dealt with in a similar manner without the House being consulted.

The COMMISSIONER of CROWN LANDS said the Government did not propose to deal with park lands. Those lands could not be so dealt with.

Mr. VAUGHAN asked if the Commissioner would see that they had a resolution before the House as they had with respect to other lands.

The COMMISSIONER of CROWN LANDS said he could only deal with the lands as the Act provided.

Mr. VERRAN asked if there was an agreement existing between the Commissioner and the University, and if so, would he lay the papers on the table.

The COMMISSIONER of CROWN LANDS said whatever papers there were he would be glad to lay on the table.
