According to the results of the University examination for the degree of LL.B., announced in to-day's issue, Mr. M. M. Bray is recommended for a Stow prize. This is the fourth time that Mr. Bray has succeeded in gaining this distinction. On his admission to the LL.B. degree next month Mr. Bray will accordingly become entitled to receive a gold medal and to be styled "Stow scholar." The previous awards of the Stow Scholarship have been to Mr. F. L. Stow in 1892, Mr. F. W. Young in 1897, Messrs. R. W. Bennett and S. H. Skipper in 1901, and to Mr. J. L. Gordon in 1904. Mr. Bray has served his articles in the office of Messrs. Young and Newland.
