In suggesting a couple of months delay in the commencement of Gross' tenure of the position you are making for him at Plymouth I was only attempting to serve his interests and to overcome the difficulties If you feel that the conwith which he is faced. sideration of the seasonal abundance of diatons is so important that you ought to insist on an early start. I shall certainly not pross any alternative. I should guess, though some of the more important species may not be available, that there would always be at Plymouth a greater variety of material than any single worker could study from the point of view of their cultural requirements. ut you are especially an expert on this matter, and I am not, so that, if you prefer to press the point, I am willing to recommend Gross to o at once.
