I have received from Oliver and Boyd your letter of June 14th about tables, and of course for my part I am fully satisfied with what you propose.

Some time ago, I sent Frank Yates an enlarged version of Table 14, on the angular transformation, giving angular values for final adjustments. In this I have retained more decimal places as well as double the number of entries.

I do not think the extra places are worth very much intrinsically, but they do give added assurance of working accuracy, and consequently enable one to recognize small differences due e.g. to changes of weighting, when, otherwise, that might seem to be ascribable to roughness in the tabular entries.

I want this enlarged table to be available to you in case you find it serviceable.
