I am asked by the author, Dr C.I.Bliss, to submit
the enclosed paper as from this Laboratory. I have been
in touch with Bliss's statistical work for some years
and have every reason to know that it is good, though I
have not checked details in the paper. I enclose also,
for your information, a note from Dr Tattersfield,
Rothamsted Experimental Station, whom I have consulted
about it. I may say that I do not think the methods
now advocated are in practice more laborious than the
old, andI find them to be more flexible when further
complications have to be taken into account.

I may say that I am myself indifferent on the matter of personal credit mentioned by Tattersfield in his reference to p.ll, but shall inform Bliss of Tattersfield's opinion when I have his letter back. I

have no doubt that Cochran is right on the two points that he makes.
