I got your letter sent to me here, in which you propose a wonderful new system of cross-cross voting. My Gran is now only just up to the ordinary method, and I am vote protectionist on my own account! Wonder if any allusion to your works has to be made in a trusted voice, should I be morally justified in trusting you with my vote? I have had two interesting talks with economists here, both a good deal puzzled about the state of the world generally, both

agreeing that a sacrificic use of tariffs is possible,
and vote much alarmed at a possible protectionist
programme if the Conservatives sweep the board.

As to Ford, I am glad you have written, though
I did not actually mean that. I may write to
him. What I want is a book mainly to show
that even if arguments are unheeded, it gives little
help to the understanding of evolution. This is a
scum.
