Dear Major Darwin,

Your letter of January 11 contained a great deal for me to think over, and one point especially about the direct effect of the differential birth-rate that seemed to me so important that I waited, and am still waiting for an opportunity to do some work on it. I am writing this just to show that I have not let the matter drop. You will be interested to hear that I have had an invitation from the Bishop of Winchester, of whom I know nothing, to take part in a small conference on "Eugenics and the Church". I think his brother of Birmingham has had a hand in it. Not knowing quite how things stood I drafted a few notes and sent them in to the Bishop. I enclose a copy in case you are interested.
