Dear Fisher, I have a bad cold
and shall not be able to do
anything this week. If you
can anyhow communicate
with Mallet I hope you will
try to see Virian on Wednesday
I have written to Virian gen-
erally on the subject, and
also to Mallet. It is
difficult to arrange matters
here so I must leave
things in your hands.

From what you and Stevenson
said I gather that putting
the questions into this census
would not now be very
useful because certain
enquiries could not be
made in the years
immediately following and
preceding the census.
Please consider whether it
would not be a good plan
to try to get the questions
in the census of 1936 on
the understanding that what
were done we should not

press for it - any other year
Please talk the matter over
with Please at Cambridge
because he knows my views
more or less. You know so
much more about the whole
question than I do
that - my presence at the
interview with Virchow
would only be useful for the
sake of appearance.
