Thanks for your account of the interview. I think you will have been doing admirable work if it results in the ages of parents being included in birth registration. It is a difficult matter of policy to decide how much to press the death register

method in view of the fact
that Stevenson seems to

results?

the Registrar General, without
further consultation with Dr.
Stevenson. I send you a

as soon as may be. Every-

please let me know.

I will retain the documents
you sent me till I hear
from you again and then
I will return them.

Of course I know this is
giving you a lot of work
but I do think it is worth
it.
