My dear Fisher,

I shall be staying at the
Burlington Hotel Cook Street, on
Wednesday Jan 26th. And if by
any chance you are coming up
to London by the train reaching
St. Pancras at 1.3. would
you come and lunch at the
Hotel with me. I am writing
to Cutler in the same sense
and possibly asking Mallet

also. My object would be to talk
over affairs generally. Before the
new plan of referring matters to the
Hon. Secretaries had come into
operation Mrs. Hodgson said
that what she rather dreaded
was having to get authority from
a committee in advance for all
arrangements to be made. She

She would welcome any discussion

What I want you really to consider is whether your committee would not be wise to give Sir B. Mellor authority to take certain intermediate responsibility. He is not a man to do it unless pressed to do so. Another suggestion I make is that you might sometimes

have an educational Comtee after the
officers meeting on the 4th

Wednesdays in the downtown.

Please understand that all these
remarks are mere suggestions
for your consideration.

save me the trouble of writing
it over again. Cork St. is
