But you could hardly send
the first paragraph without
saying that it is from a
letter received by you.
I am flattered by your
citing it.

I wrote to Callell
yesterday & tried to make
a point which I do not
myself see quite clearly.
There is a considerable amount
of fiction which his doors
moving from one social

class to another. This results
is whole families often remaining
in the class in which born.
Does not this make it more
probable that the selection of
one of the family rise or
fall into another class is due
to heredity? Best I ought
not to bother you with such
conundrums.
