Dear Fisher.

I must correct a wrong impression which I seem to have given. I do not say that the two departments at Cold Spring Harbour will be amalgamated, only that one person, Dr Campbell, wishes this to take place.

As to Laughlin, my belief is that he was wonderfully successful in persuading the Senate about immigration laws, and that he gave the Stroutyat in movement material practical aid. He has done

Something real, and he has
run his show for many
years. If he has a young
biologist placed over him,
he, being a poor man, will

On the other hand the part-
played by biologists in the
field of Eugenics has been most-
disappointing. Few have given
the movement a real shove
forward, and I fear that
jealousy has been one cause
of their standing aloof. I do
not believe in psychoanalysis,
but I do think that people
are very often influenced by

low motives without being
aware of the fact. Pearl was
jealous when the economical
Fisher was put at the head
of the Eugenic movement in
America, and has been nasty
ever since. Not many can
seek to promote truth without
some thoughts of self-affecting
them - You may be perfectly
right in all your views, but
the above are my reasons for
intermitting doubts. Anyhow -
I am making no more in
the matter, and I am on the
whole glad that the time
for my putting in an oar is
nearly over.
