My dear Henry,

Thanks very much for your note. I had been looking forward to seeing something of Dominula again this year, as indeed it becomes more interesting every time we learn more about it. I was not quite sure how it would fit in with the Genetical Society's meeting announced for Oxford on July 21st. I do hope I shall see you there, though it is only for the day, and perhaps you would then have a better idea about when it would be best for me to come over for two or three nights, if I may, to join in the Dominula catching. Judging from Lythrum, which

usually flowers by about the tenth of July and in 1942 was out before the end of June, this looks likely to be a late year...at least for the phenology of high summer, so perhaps Dominula too will be behind schedule.

I am so glad to hear about the books, and of course am looking forward greatly to the big butterfly book. It will be a good opportunity for my Department to get the new edition of Mendelism and Evolution.
