My dear Henry,

I have sent Taylor a copy of the few words I drafted before for LeGros Clark. I am glad that the Scandinavian, whoever he was, has secured evidence of enhanced antibody content in certain cases of pregnancy, since for years now Taylor has known that I wanted to secure just such evidence. With a source of danger which has been in equilibrium for perhaps millions of generations, all kinds of complications might have accrued which are likely to be puzzling to an investigator expecting a simple situation, e.g., the shedding factor may be an essential part of the mechanism.

In view of the row at the Zoo, I suppose I cannot hope to get away before the end of the month, though I am rather needing a little holiday.
