About dimorphism, I shall certainly be writing, but I hope much later, say a year hence; meanwhile if you think it worth while to mention my suggestion, the best case to take would be my remarks on Papilio polytes and Colias. I am very glad you see the point of that argument from genetic balance, as it makes hay of Haldane's assumption underlying

"Fisher's theory cannot explain ....."  
in fact "Je n'en <sup>v</sup>croie pas la nécessité".

The polymorphic types like Apotettix will be fascinating when the more complete observations have been taken.
