My dear Ron,

First, I am glad to tell you that Michie has got a Studentship from the Medical Research Council. But I have done that with Wright before, not so well as you would, but I have much more than held my own. When he sees that things are going against him, he retreats behind his mathematics whence I cannot dig him out! It would be grand indeed if you would consent to come and help.

The occasion is three weeks next Manage (November 24th) at 5 p.m.

I would, with so much pleasure, put you up for the night (and the one before, if you could spare the time). I have arranged, long ago, to go to Somerset from the 25th to 28th and so would have to leave on the Friday morning. But that does not interfere in any way.

There is no need to say what a great pleasure it would be to have you - and your support!
