My dear Huxley,

Thanks for your letter. I do not think that it would be worth taking up the time of you, or of the Rockefeller representatives, with the slight difficulties of my own Department, which I hope to be able to get over from time to time as they arise. The position is that the future location of the Department is so obscure, the College having deferred making decisions about returning to London until September next, that I could not, for quite a while, gauge my real needs. In any case I hope these will be quite moderate, so that I can carry on temporarily until the matter is more ripe for discussion. Thanks for your note all the same.
