I am extremely glad that you find the outcome of the bird work interesting. What I mean to do is to revise the whole of the calculations and submit a paper, probably much like what you have seen, to the R.S. I may say that my first idea was the P.Z.S. naturally because of your present association with that journal, but I find myself rather strongly advised that the R.S. Proceedings would bring the work more immediately ^{before} an audience likely to be interested.

I should like very much to try and give a brief account, say 10 minutes, or more if you think it preferable, at a Zoo meeting, without publication in your Proceedings.
