Dear Huxley.

I have received your draft letter to the "Times" and shall sign it with pleasure if you will alter the word "influence" to "increase", so as to speak of the economic schemes designed to increase the birth-rate, which is, of course, their real purpose, although it sounds like blasphemy to the more fanatical Malthusians.

About your suggested amendments to the subject matter: I should like, with you, to delete the two words "sociological and" from No.7, since "eugenic effects" is quite ^{wide} ~~right~~ enough. On the other hand, the word "historical" has quite a definite purpose in No.4, as showing the admissibility of special studies of a particular period, or of a particular culture such as the Islamic, which are ordinarily spoken of as historical studies rather than biological or sociological.

I am sending you a signed copy of the letter for you to send on. I think it ought not to be from the Eugenics Society but from our respective locations.
