Dyke's first lot from Wolverhampton looked perfectly normal:

For ~~men~~ there are 43 AB against 46.996 expected and for men 72 against 71.946.

The new lot agree in the proportion of A, but that of B is down to almost half of the earlier lot. About $3\frac{1}{2}\%$ seem to have been transferred from B to O, a very few perhaps from AB to A. I am in some doubt as to how we ought to treat data which look thoroughly bad on internal evidence. Are you doing anything about it?
