## GNALOOMA AND MARDATHONI TRIBES

("Yabaroo" states that although the dialects vary in each district, a remarkable analogy of structure and idiom runs through them all. It is through this that it is so much easier for an aboriginal to learn the other native dialects than a European. Similar words are used in many of the languages, but in each they have an entirely different meaning. Their grammatical contruction is much the same and they have a great capacity for expressing several ideas in one word. Many of the more guttural languages have a softened dialect.)
